


The Bible is the Word of God



God Told Jeremiah What to Write

JEREMIAH 36

Jeremiah was a prophet. A *prophet* is someone God calls to deliver a message to His people. God told Jeremiah to take a scroll and write on it. God wanted Jeremiah to write everything He had said to him about Israel, Judah, and all the nations.



The people were going to be punished

for their sins. God wanted the people to hear about everything that was going to happen, so they could stop doing evil things, and ask for forgiveness. God wanted to forgive their sin.

CONVERSATION

Jeremiah asked Baruch to help him. Jeremiah told Baruch everything God said. Baruch wrote it all on the scroll. Then Jeremiah asked Baruch to go to the temple and read the scroll to the people. Jeremiah hoped the people would listen to God, turn away from their sin, and ask for forgiveness.

All the officials heard Baruch read the scroll and were very afraid. They wanted to tell the king what Jeremiah had said as soon as possible. The officials told Baruch and Jeremiah to hide while they went to the king.

It was winter, King Jehoiakim was sitting in front of a fire when the officials came with the scroll. The officials read the scroll to the king. As soon as the official would read three or four columns, the king would cut the scroll with a knife and throw it into the fire. Some men asked the king not to burn the scroll, but he did not listen. The king demanded the officials bring Baruch and Jeremiah to him, but God kept them safe in hiding.

God asked Jeremiah to take another scroll and write everything down again. Baruch and Jeremiah were faithful and did what God told them to do.
