





CONVERSATION

Prophets Told About Jesus

ISAIAH 7:14; 9:6; 11:1-5; **MICAH 5:2**

Hundreds of years before Jesus was born, prophets shared God's messages with the people. Some messages reminded the people that they had not obeyed God's laws. Other messages reminded the people that someday God would send His Son to the world!

Almost 750 years before Jesus was born, the prophet Isaiah wrote God's message that a very special baby would be born. Isaiah shared these details about

Jesus' birth: "A virgin will have a son and name Him Immanuel (which means God with us)." God planned to send Jesus to be the Savior.

Later, Isaiah wrote about Jesus again. Isaiah said that a special child would be born and that the government would be on His shoulders. Isaiah shared that the child would be named Wonderful Counselor, the Mighty God, Eternal Father, and Prince of Peace. The many different names explained who Jesus is.

Isaiah's third message said that Jesus would be from Jesse's family. Jesse was King David's father. Isaiah told people that the Spirit of God would be with Jesus and that Jesus would be righteous and faithful. Isaiah wrote that Jesus would be wise and understanding. He would love and respect the Lord. He would treat people fairly. He would put an end to evil.

Isaiah is not the only prophet who heard God's promise about the coming Savior. God told the prophet Micah exactly where the Messiah (God's chosen One) would be born. Micah wrote, "Bethlehem, you are small. But from you will come the ruler of Israel. He has been alive since ancient times."

People waited many years. When Jesus arrived, everything that the prophets had written was true!
