THE ACTS: MISSION CONTROL

"The Message That Started It All" *Acts 2:14-36* June 7, 2015 AM Service

We are in a series talking about the early church and its beginnings and what that means for us today. In this section we are talking about the Mission Control – talking a look behind the scenes if you will at what was happening in the early church – taking a look back and pulling back the curtain to see the mission control.

We pick up today where we left off last week – the Holy Spirit had been given to these 120 Followers who had been waiting in Jerusalem and there were 3 incredible signs given including them being able to speak in other known languages that the people who were there from other nations could hear and understand. There was a huge crowd that had gathered and they had questions and looking for answers.

So Peter is going to respond and explain what was happening and really in this short sermon we see one word, one thing, one person – His name is Jesus. I really could stop at that and we could all go home! But we won't! This is the first message that was ever preached in the church and this message is the same message that we are going to share today because it is this message and no other that the Church and Christ Followers should be sharing today – There is one name under heaven by which men might be saved – Jesus! The Church isn't here to bless animals or do just social justice ministries or host meetings or have social gatherings – it is here and was founded on this truth – to share the love and power of the Gospel which is Jesus Christ!

The Cause of the Message – The Culture – Crowd Vs 15 **Answers to the Culture's Questions**

This is a critical and vital role of the Church – explain to the culture who Jesus is and why He matters in their lives and in our lives! He tells them – guys let's be practical here – Jews don't drink before 9 a.m. which is what time it was and 2^{nd} they weren't Cajuns from Louisiana! Game day in Baton Rouge – early games – oh yes! Not only that – it was a feast day and no good Jew would be drunk and on top of that was an hour of prayer and they wouldn't be drunk during this either!

Sometimes we just need to speak practically into people's lives! Let's remember we have something worth sharing and we have a message that is defendable!

The Courage of the Messenger Vs 14

Check out here the radical transformation in Peter's life from the nigh that he denied Christ. One person speaking Aramaic stands and though they were all there with him – speaks and explains.

Reflect back on Peter's life the last time he was made fun of, mocked or put to the test. How did he react? Like a coward. (Flesh this out) Denied Christ three times, just as Jesus said he would

Even the third time, cussing at the servant girl who asked him.

But now empowered by the boldness given through the Holy Spirit his answer is entirely different! A completely different man, transformed! Look at what it says! Listen to me, hear my words!

The same threats, same chance of persecution was there, but something had changed!

An encouraging word to all of us, perhaps you have never asked Christ into your life, no matter what you have done, where you have been, Christ can change you and make you new.

Maybe a Christian and you have walked away from your faith, been disobedient, and think that God won't have you back, you're wrong! Be encouraged by the life of Peter!

Notice as well that the other eleven are standing with him.

Remember, we are never alone because we are a part of the body Christ. It may look that way and even feel that way, but now you are not standing and sharing alone!

Boldness in the midst of adversity furthers the gospel. Acts 4:13; Ephesians 6:19; Philippians 1:20

The Content & Centrality of the Message – JESUS Vs 16-35

✓ Explaining the Scripture – OT – Joel 2:28-32

Peter does what any faithful preacher does – not give a bunch of good advice and how to's but brings the Scripture (here their Scripture is the OT) to light and explains it is relevant to them - in this case – what did

the Word of God have to say about what was happening and what were they to do about it!

The Beginning of the Last Days Vs 16-18

Explain difference in OT with the Holy Spirit and now

People ask – are we living in the last days and the answer is YES! We have been since the day Jesus ascended!

The End of the Last Days Vs 19-20

We don't think those things happened then so why use this passage? It is about the end of days! The Jews missed them – then and now – saw the Messiah coming and doing both of these at the same time!

This will be fulfilled in Revelation 6-18

The Hope of the Last Days vs 20-21

Because we are living on those last days Peter says and it echoes even to today - every men and women can call on the name of the Lord and be saved and His Spirit would enter their life forever. It is a day that will eventually end when Christ returns

Jesus is the Fulfillment of the Old Testament.

✓ **Examining the Evidence** – Jesus – Incarnation, etc.

Peter then begins and finishes laying out that God had prepared before time for Jesus to come live, die and rise again and this is the message of the Gospel – Peter lays out the evidence of who Jesus was and is!

The Comprehensiveness of the Message Vs 21

Vs 33

Let's look back to Verse 21 and see what Joel said all the way back in the OT that is still true today. **It's a Whoever Story and Invitation** There is no qualifier, race, status, rich or poor, where you live, who your parents were or are, where you grew up, when you hear – it doesn't matter. The

great news about the message is that is for everyone everywhere. That means if you are hear this morning and you've never understood this message is for you too!

The Claim & Certainty of the Message Vs 36

God Made Him Both Lord and Christ

Let us be clear and it one that grows increasingly less believed and those who do are often called bigoted or to narrow, or not tolerant but Peter here says clearly, that God made a declaration and one that Jesus also made too. He is the Lord and the Christ. Jesus said it in John 14:6 too!

Josh McDowell says in his book More Than a Carpenter that you and have to do something with Jesus. We cannot deny he lived on this earth and died and rose again. There is too much overwhelming evidence and we see Peter discuss much of it here. He offers and I agree that we have to say one of three things about Jesus. He isn't some great teacher or a prophet or some great moral man who had some great teachings – His life and His own teaching don't allow room for that! So He is either a Liar, Lunatic or He is the Lord!

The Challenge & Choice of the Message Life change comes through Jesus.

2 Corinthians 5:17; Ephesians 4:22–24; Colossians 3:1–3

So let us be clear this morning dear friend – there is a clear challenge offered here from Peter's lips to our own ears this morning. Many of you have already made that decision but there are some here this morning that have not made that decision. Again, let me be clear, not asking if you have joined a church, been religious, been sprinkled or baptized been confirmed, I am asking you clearly just as Peter does this people – do you know Christ as YOUR Savior and Lord – have you made that life-changing decision that changed your life forever? If not you can do that today! ABC's

Our Commitment to the Message

Petal FBC Family – we must be so committed to this message and only this message. It must drive us to share it to sacrifice in order to share it, to be willing to go anywhere and share it anytime. The message must be about Jesus. How we share the message may change, the environment in which we do that but one thing never changes – JESUS!
